Move than 220 million people speak French on the five continents. The OIF, an international organisation of French-speaking countries, comprises FF member States and governments. French is also the only language, alongside English, that is taught in every country in the world. France operates the tiggest international network of cultural institutes, which run French-language courses for close on a million learners.

A knowledge of French opens the closers of French companies in France and other French-speaking parts of the world (Canada, Snitzerland, Belgium, and the continent of Africa). As the world's fifth biggest economy and third-ranking clestination for foreign investment, France is a key economic partner.

Speaking French opens up study opportunities at renowned French universities and business schools, ranked among the top higher colucation institutions in Europe and the world. French is both a working language and an official language of the United Nations, the European Union, UNESCO, NATO, the International Olympic Committee, the International Red Cross and international courts.

After English and German, French is the third most violety used language on the Internet, ahead of Spanish.
